

During the long hot day, the crocodile rests on the mud of the river banks. It lies very still and, as its body is just the colour of mud, it is difficult to see it unless it moves or is disturbed. Its body and long tail are covered with a hard, horny skin.

Very few people like the crocodile. Its cruel eyes and huge jaw full of teeth us. Usually, a crocodile carries off its prey, hides it in an underground burrow and eats it when the flesh is rotten. The crocodile catches its prey by quietly swimming to it, snapping at the victim with its jaws and dragging it under water and drowning it. It eats all kinds of animals like dogs, cats, deer, snakes, fish, smaller crocodiles and even human beings. Though the crocodile has such a large number of teeth, it cannot chew on meat. It breaks up its food by shaking its head violently from side to side or rolling its body to tear the flesh from dead 10 animals.

Although the skin of the crocodile is hard, it can lash its long tail with such great force that any man or animal can be knocked off their feet. It is this huge tail that allows the crocodile to swim. Its short legs enable it to walk on land or to crawl along the bottom of muddy rivers. When the crocodile swims to the surface of the river to breathe, its body remains under water and only its nostrils can be seen just above the surface. When it has breathed enough air, it can close its nostrils and so remain under water for as long as half an hour.


