Without any delay, Paul and his mother quickly ran to the top of the mountain that overlooked the sea. Although Paul had never witnessed a tsunami before, he knew what it was. He had learnt in school a few days ago that a tsunami is a very dangerous large wave that will wreck many houses. The last one that hit his island a few years ago was over seven metres high! Paul knew that he and his mother would be safe on top of the mountain. However, he did not know if his father would be safe.

Paul's mother tried to console him. She told him not to be worried as a tsunami would be more dangerous for people on the islands than it would be for fishermen on their boats in the ocean. She explained that the impact of the tsunami would be very small out in the deeper part of the ocean. His father would probably not even know that it was passing right under his boat.

She was right. Paul's father came home safely that night. Paul heaved a sigh of relief. He learnt from this experience that they had to react fast and get to safety every time the warning alert sounded.
