



One morning two years ago, Bob stood in a take struggling to clear a blocked water pipe. The water was cold. The metal rod he was using was heavy. The bottom of the take was also slippery, making it difficult for him to stay upright. It was demanding work, even for someone who had always kept himself fit.

After ten minutes, Bob put his left foot on the edge of the large submerged pipe and took a breather. He was discussing other strategies with his two coworkers when, without warning, the lake's placid surface turned into a whirlpool. "This huge hole just opened up in front of me," Bob recalls, "with a big swirl like a giant toilet getting flushed." The blockage thad suddenly cleared. With no obstruction in the way, tonnes of lake water rushed rapidly towards and through the pipe. The force was immense. It whisked the rod out of Bob's grip and threw him easily against the mouth of the pipe. Bob was sure he heard his thigh bone snap but he had no time to worry about that. The waters were swirling around his head and he could not free himself from the pipe.

Bob had not even been planning to work that day. Eadier that morning, his co-workers. Mike and Sam, had called to tell him to bring his waterproof boots to them because theirs were damaged.
