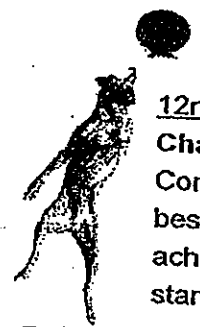

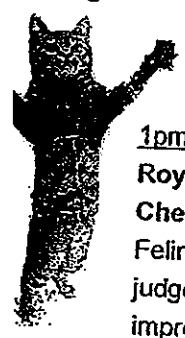

When I was in junior high school, what my friends thought of me was really important to me. During those years, I grew much taller than most of my peers. Though I was tall and big for any child of my age, I was very sensitive. Being so tall made me feel uncomfortable. In order to keep the focus off me and my unusual height, I went along with the crowd who would play practical jokes on other children at school. Being one of the class clowns gave me a way to make sure that the jokes were directed at others and not at me. 5

I would pull all kinds of pranks that were hurtful, sometimes even harmful, to others. Once before art lesson, my friends and I placed super glue on the seat of one of our classmates. The poor guy ripped his shorts as he stood up to answer a question. I let out the hardest laugh ever. Not only was he terribly embarrassed, he also had to go to the school nurses' office. I thought that it was funny but it ended up that no one else thought so – least of all my father. 10

My parents did not always think that my behaviour was funny. They reminded me about the Golden Rule: Treat others as I would like to be treated. Many times, I was disciplined for the hurtful way I was treating others. What I was doing was hurting other classmates and in turn hurting my reputation as someone to be looked up to. My friends were looking up to me because I was tall, but what did they see? 15

My parents wanted me to be a leader who was a good example to others – to be a decent human being. They taught me to set my own goals and to do the best at everything that I set out to do. During the lectures that I got from my father, he told me over and over again to be the leader that I was meant to be – to be a big man in words and actions, as well as in my body. I had to question myself whether or not it was important to be the kind of leader and person my father believed I was inside. I knew in my heart that he was right. Thus I tried my best to follow my father's advice. 20

Once I focussed on being the best that I could be, I realised that I became a leader in my very own way. Because of my height, I joined the basketball team and became a leader in the game. I took my responsibility to set a good example very seriously. I sometimes have to stop and think before I act, and I make mistakes occasionally. As they say: to err is human, to forgive divine. With such a steadfast mindset, I continue to look for opportunities where I can make a difference and to be a good example because of my father's advice. I now pass it on to you: Be a leader, Shaq, not a follower. Since people already have to look up to you, give them a good reason to do so. 25

"Bopsy, you are," the chief affirmed. With those words, Bopsy, feeling a sense of satisfaction, smiled and closed his eyes for the last time.

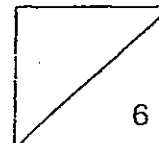
